The Conference will include invited and contributed papers. Contributed papers will be selected for

oral or poster presentations. Ichthyological society of Korea, the co-host of FISH-BOL 2012, requests

the keynote speakers as well as the invited speakers to submit a full paper to the conference so that

the society can publish the papers in a special volume of the society's journal. It is highly

recommended that the full papers be submitted by May 15, 2012.

Abstract guidelines:

Once the abstracts are submitted, a sub-committee of ISSC will determine their acceptance.

An abstract that does not conform to the following guidelines will be returned to the author for revision.

Language: English

Format: Rich Text Format (.rtf) or Word (.doc) file

Max size: 300 words (body)

No pictures, tables, or graphs

Download Abstract Template (pdf<0.1Mb; doc<0.1Mb) for details

Note: Preferred type of presentation should be marked.

Steps to submit an abstract:

1. Format an abstract according to the instructions in the abstract template

2. Register the conference through on-line system

3. Submit the abstract through on-line system

4. Confirmation email will be sent to you instantly, after abstract submission

Abstract Acceptance

Notification: by April 15, 2012

Abstract submitters will receive a notification email by April 15, 2012 from FISH-BOL 2012 Secretariat

regarding the acceptance of their abstracts either as oral or poster presentation.*

Session conveners will do their best to accommodate authors' preferences for oral or poster

presentations. However, the number of oral presentations accepted for each session will be limited by

the availability of timeslots. Therefore, some of the abstracts might be moved to the poster session. A

sub-committee of ISSC for abstract selection reserves the right to reject submitted abstracts which are poorly written, do not follow the abstract guidelines, and/or are completely beyond the scope of the conference.

- Multiple entries are permitted for as long as visa remains valid.

- : Visa provided under multiple-entry visa Agreement: duration specified by an agreement.
- : Visa provided for national benefit: duration specified by the Minister of Justice

Yeosu is one of the country's most picturesque port cities especially at night. Famous for its seafood,

beaches, flowers and marinas, it is developing as an international ocean resort and tourist destination

as well as being selected as a host city for the 2012 World Expo in Yeosu Harbor.

The city of Yeosu consists of the Yeosu peninsula as well as 317 islands (49 inhabited, 268

uninhabited) with population of 300,000. Yeosu is a city of history and loyalty where the headquarters

of South Jeolla Province Navy Base was located, and the Great Admiral Yi Sun Shin invented the

Geobukseon or "a turtle ship" to save the country while serving as the Navy Commander when Japan

invaded Korea in 16th century.

Lying about midway along the southern coast of South Korea, Yeosu has cool summers and mild

winters thanks to the sea wind and warm current. Its blessed ocean climate also brings Yeosu

relatively longer springs and autumns than other regions.
